Road Updates

With Critical Path Construction underway, Perpetua will be providing weekly road updates on its website: www.PerpetuaResources.com

Intermittent road delays will occur if you are traveling Warm Lake Road.

Safety is Perpetua's top priority. Crews will perform dust abatement on Johnson Creek & Stibnite Roads. Large loads will have pilot vehicles equipped with signage, lights and indicators providing convoy vehicle totals.

Perpetua will do its best to limit large convoy traffic to Mon - Fri and avoid hauling weekends and holidays.

Stibnite is an active construction zone, please be prepared for possible delays when passing through.
